## Public Notice

Dear Carlisle residents,

As the Senior Director of Water and Wastewater, I would like to thank you for your continued support and patience and apologize for the inconvenience you have faced with the June 18<sup>th</sup> watering ban.

We are now able to move towards the mandatory outdoor water use program agreed upon at the Carlisle public meeting in May 2006. This means Carlisle residents may again water between the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and again from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on their designated odd or even day. This exemption to the ban is designed to take advantage of people's natural watering habits. We would like to **encourage** residents with automated sprinklers to water only in the morning hours and residents with manual watering systems to water only in the evening hours.

It is imperative for residents to understand the importance of following the mandatory hours listed in the outdoor water use program. The city requires an opportunity to fill the elevated water storage tank both mid-day and during the night to prepare for the next cycle of water use and meet the water needs of Carlisle residents.

With the new recently completed well upgrades, the city will be producing approximately 40 to 42 litres per second of water compared to 28 litres per second over the last few years. This should allow us to fill the tower more quickly. But, only if residents strictly adhere to the time schedules imposed.

I would like to invite each of you to come out to the official opening and tour the new well house on Tuesday, June 27 at 10:00 a.m. and at 6:30 p.m.

As we move forward, I would like to thank you in advance for your anticipated support and strict adherence to the mandatory outdoor water use program restrictions.

Working together, I'm confident we can solve this issue.

# Outdoor Water Ban Modified

## 2006 Mandatory Outdoor Water Use Program Imposed

Residents may again water between the hours of: 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and then again from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. on their designated odd or even day.

All residents across Hamilton must abide by Hamilton's Waterworks By-law R84-026 which restricts lawn and garden watering to every other day.

### City of Hamilton Waterworks By-law R84-026

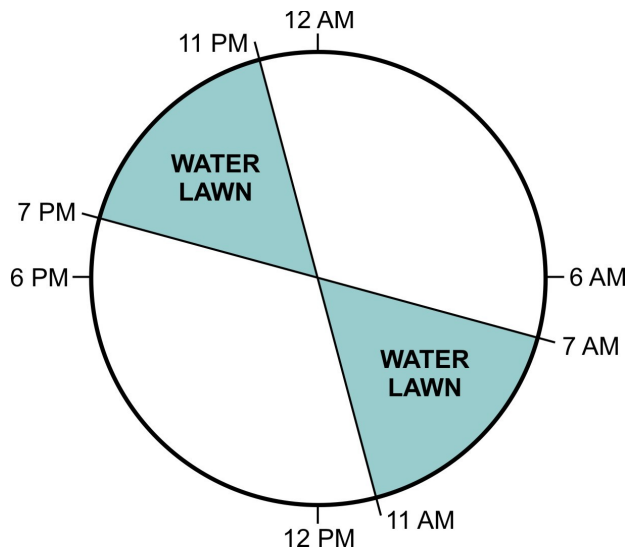
The City of Hamilton Waterworks By-law R84-026 restricts lawn and garden watering to every other day.

- Even-numbered municipal addresses are permitted to water on even-numbered days
- Odd-numbered municipal addresses are permitted to water on odd-numbered days
- Residents without a municipal address, located on the west and north sides of the street are permitted to water on even-numbered days
- Residents without a municipal address, located on the east and south sides of the street are permitted to water on odd-numbered days

Any person contravening the outdoor watering ban (outside the permitted watering times), on the first offence will receive a warning. On the second offence, a Provincial Offences Notice may be issued in the amount of \$365 (including surcharge and costs) and/or the initiation of court proceedings. All subsequent offences may result in the initiation of court proceedings which provides for a penalty of up to \$5,000 under the Provincial Offences Act. City of Hamilton By-law enforcement officers patrol areas to ensure compliance with the ban.

To ensure continuous water service to all residents, both this Mandatory Outdoor Water Ban Modified and By-law R84-026 will be enforced.
